1. Call to Order.

Supervisor Keith Potter called the meeting to order at 7PM. Janella Hop opened with prayer.

4. Graafschap Fire Department.

Fire Chief Cal Haverdink reported 24 calls for service in April of which 6 were into Fillmore Township consisting of 4 rescues and 2 fires.

The annual awards dinner will be held at the station on June 2 at 6PM. Elected officials and spouses are invited.

5. Fillmore Township Deputy Report.

Deputy Ron Haverdink reported 47 calls for service during April.

6. Allegan County Commissioner.

No report from Commissioner Steve McNeal.

7. Paul DeVisser Request.

Paul and Cara DeVisser of 4775 52nd St. were present requesting approval to hold Equestrian Team practices at that address on May 14,21,28 and June 4,11, and 18. Neighbors Ken Lemmen has no problem with practices, however he questions the number of horses allowed on the property. He feels Mr. DeVisser is breaking Township Ordinance by having horses boarded on the property. Fillmore Township Ordinance allows 9 horses on this size property. Mr. DeVisser presently owns 7 horses and has 2 stalls available for rent. Lauri DenBleyker feels the DeVisser's have misused the private drive with trailers and heavy traffic.

After discussion a motion was brought by Keith Potter 2nd John Kleinheksel to permit the requested activity. PASSED 5-0.

8. Doug Troost Request.

Doug Troost of 5714 143rd Ave. was present requesting approval for Mud Run events on this property. Mr. Troost has had these events on the past and the Township Board has received comments from neighboring property owners concerning noise. A motion was brought by John Kleinheksel 2nd Kenneth DeWeerdt to allow Mr. Troost to hold these events June 7, July 5, August 2, September 6 and October 4, from 1p-6p, however if on any of these dates the event becomes a nuisance or violates the Public Nuisance & Anti-Noise Ordinance as determined by our Township Deputy or Township Board, the following events will be disallowed. PASSED 4-1.

9. May 6, 2008 School Election.

Clerk Kenneth DeWeerdt reported very light turnout for the School election as a total of 133 voters participated.
