1. Call to Order.

Supervisor Ken DeWeerdt called the meeting to order at 7pm; Elaine Mokma opened with prayer and led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. Roll Call.

Members Present: Ken DeWeerdt, Leah Folkert, Elaine Mokma, Bob Yonker and Chuck Schaap. Members Absent: None.

3. Late Agenda Items.

a. East Saugatuck Cemetery Fencing

4. Graafschap Fire Department.

Fire Chief Doug DenBleyker reported;

a. A total of 62 calls for April 2019. There were 10 rescue calls and 4 fire call for Fillmore Township, also 3 fire calls to other agencies.

8. Fillmore Township Board of Trustees Minutes - April 9, 2019.

9. Fillmore Township Planning Commission.

a. A Public Hearing was held on May 13, 2019 to consider a rezoning request from Brad Lanser for parcel #0306-017-027-00 & 0306-017-027-10, located at 5658 143rd Ave., Holland, MI., to rezone these parcels from A-2 Agriculture to C-2 Commercial.

A Motion was brought by Chuck Schaap and 2nd by Bob Yonker to approve the rezoning request of Brad Lanser as was recommended by the Planning Commission.

PASSED 5-0.

b. A Site Plan Review for Renew TRC, Parcel #0306-011-008-20 located on 146th Ave. was reviewed and recommended by Planning Commission.

A Motion was brought by Chuck Schaap and 2nd by Bob Yonker to approve the Site Plan with the contingencies so noted in the minutes of the Planning Commission. PASSED 5-0.

c. The Minutes of the April 8, 2019 were received for information.

10. Supervisor Updates.

a. A Motion was brought by Ken DeWeerdt and 2nd by Elaine Mokma to support The Holland Zeeland Community Foundation annual July 4th firework celebration with a donation of \$705.00.

PASSED 5-0.

b. A Motion was brought by Ken DeWeerdt and 2nd by Elaine Mokma to support the Holland American Legion Band with a Music Scholarship of \$500.00 for the 2019 season. PASSED 5-0.

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c. A bid was received from Overisel Electric for Township Office lighting retrofit.

A Motion was brought by Chuck Schaap and 2nd by Elaine Mokma for the Township to purchase the bulbs and Overisel Electric to do the installation.

PASSED 5-0.

- d. A request was received from Lakeshore Advantage for investment support in the amount of \$1,875.00 for 2019. This request will be looked at again late summer of 2019 to see what funds are available.
- e. Information was received from M.A.C.C. of a proposed increase of \$715.20 in Watershed Program Dues for 2020. Grants are inconsistent thereby leaving the program inadequately funded. This was received for information.
- f. A donation request was received from the Allegan County Community Foundation to assist in the building of a memorial to the five branches of our nation's military. This memorial will be erected on M-40 near the Heath Township Hall.

A Motion was brought by Ken DeWeerdt and 2nd by Elaine Mokma to donate \$2000.00 for a Memorial Bench. Monies to be given in \$1000.00 increments, with \$1000.00 now and \$1000.00 near the end of the calendar year.

PASSED 5-0.

g. Information was received from the O.D.C regarding Park Management Service Agreement for the Cottonwood Park and Fillmore Discovery Park. Annual cost for these services for 2019 will again be \$9,000.00.

11. May 7, 2019 Zeeland School Election.

Clerk Mokma reported this election was consolidated to Salem Township. A total of 12 ballots were cast all those being from absentee voters.

Allegan County Clerk Bob Genetski submitted a letter to the Board of Trustees outlining a precedent setting in that multiple unfunded mandates from state government, created with the passage of Proposal 3 of 2018 was forced on townships and cities throughout Michigan for the first time. This was received for information.
